

GREEN INITIATIVES

Alderbrook Resort & Spa is committed to preserving the natural beauty that surrounds the resort through sustainable, eco-friendly initiatives. From using environmentally friendly products, to providing oversized, reusable in-room amenities to cut back on waste, Alderbrook's eco-friendly practices are constantly evolving to keep the guest and the environment top of mind.

Green SEAL-recognized housekeeping chemicals – Alderbrook Resort & Spa utilizes an evergrowing selection of environmentally friendly products. The hotel searches out products that are made with less energy and fewer materials while delivering the same service. These products:

- Are sold in bulk to reduce the amount of packaging
- Are made with recycled materials, use renewable resources and not fossil fuels
- Have extended durability and reuse potential
- Contain no toxics or toxic chemicals

Culture of Recycling – Alderbrook Resort & Spa is committed to cultivating a strong recycling culture. Paper, cardboard, plastic and glass are recycled from all areas of the property, including the resort offices, function spaces, and food and beverage outlets.

Voluntary Towel/Linen Service – Alderbrook Resort & Spa offers a voluntary towel/linen service. Linens are only changed every third day unless requested to be changed sooner. Towels that are hung on racks are not replaced, unless specifically requested.

Sales Collateral – Alderbrook Resort & Spa has created a completely electronic sales kit, which includes electronic proposal capabilities, and a dynamic and informative website with virtual tours of the property to minimize the need for single use marketing collateral.

In-room Amenities – Alderbrook Resort & Spa provides the luxurious and all-natural Molton Brown bath amenities in bulk dispensers to reduce excessive waste of sample size bottles.

Renovation – During the 2002 renovation, Alderbrook Resort & Spa revitalized the stream that runs through the property as a local salmon habitat. Resting pools running throughout the property have been carefully preserved and approved by the Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife to encourage annual salmon spawning.

Water Treatment Plant – Alderbrook Resort & Spa also boasts its own waste-water removal plant. After a thorough cleansing process and filtering process, the plant pumps much-needed oxygenated water back into the depleted Hood Canal.
