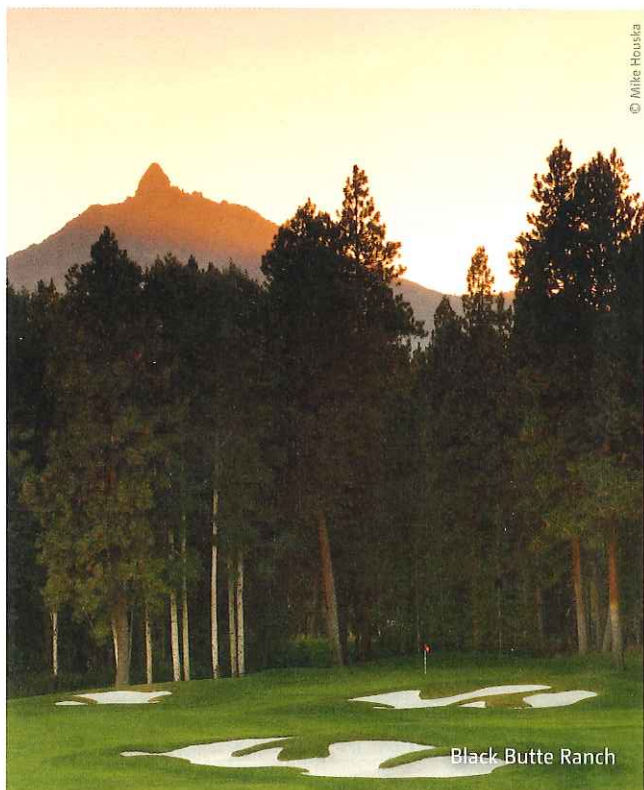

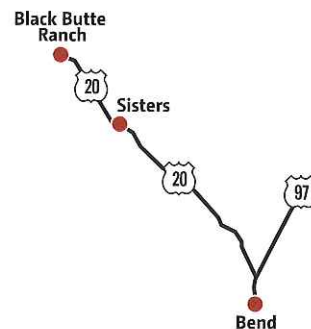

The resort's second course opened in 1982. Glaze Meadow always played second fiddle to its older sibling but, following a \$3.75M renovation, it promises to become every bit as popular when it re-opens on June 30 this year. The renovation rebuilt greens, tees, bunkers, cart paths and the irrigation system. Next, came a fresh new look, which meant the removal of trees to open up playing corridors, enhance the views and lend it a classic motif.

Vacation rentals on the 1,800-acre property include 112 cabins, homes and condos. For those hours not on one of the

courses, Black Butte Ranch offers a spa and an array of dining options from fine cuisine to pub fare.
